Odessa Community Clean Up Day

Dumpsters will be available at Dyer Park (601 W Main) for your brush and yard waste, electronic waste and large household items (refrigerators cannot contain Freon). Brush and natural vegetation may also be dropped off at the City's Northwest Wastewater Treatment Plant (7174 Hughes Road). We cannot accept trash, junk, or other debris at this drop off site.

No household hazardous waste or tires will be accepted at either site. For hazardous waste, please contact Jan Vahrenberg in Mayview at 816-263-1072. She allows most hazardous waste but no tires. Drop offs are welcome every third Saturday of the month between 1:00-4:00 pm in downtown Mayview on E Highway across from Michelle's Restaurant. Voting in the April Election

The annual election of officials of the City of Odessa will be held on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. Voting locations are the Community Building at Dyer Park and the New Horizons Presbyterian Church on Hwy 131. Please check your voter registration card for your location. Get Help with Heating and Cooling Bills

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to assist low income individuals who pay a large proportion of their income in meeting their home energy needs. This Program targets elderly, disabled and households with young children. The State of Missouri Family Support Division applies for and receives LIHEAP funding and then contracts with Missouri Community Action Agencies to conduct the eligibility determination for LIHEAP applications.

LIHEAP has two components: Energy Assistance (EA) and Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP). Eligibility requirements for LIHEAP are based on income, household size, available resources and responsibility for payment of home energy costs. When Snow is in the Forecast

During a snow storm, city crews will treat the streets with sand and salt. They will normally begin around 6:00 am on the morning of or the morning after the storm. The major streets of Main, Mason, Dryden, Johnson, Phillips, First, Third, North Fourth, South Fifth, and South Ninth streets will be treated and plowed first. Other streets will be done as quickly as possible depending on the conditions. Please avoid parking vehicles on streets when snow is forecasted.
