CITY OF ODESSA STAY HOME ORDER EXTENDED

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

To further combat the spread of COVID-19 in Odessa, Mayor Adam Couch, under the authority of Ordinance 3008, has extended and modified the Stay Home Order through <u>May 3, 2020</u>.

Has anything changed from the previous Stay Home Order?

The definitions and intent of the original Ordinance is still in effect. However, the goal of this extension is to slowly and methodically allow non-essential businesses to reopen while still observing the gathering and social distancing requirements set forth in the original Ordinance and in accordance with the State of Missouri Stay Home Order.

Can non-essential businesses open back up?

Under the Extension Order No. 01-2020, non-essential businesses may reopen on Saturday, April 25, 2020, as long as they adhere to the limitations on social gatherings of ten (10) or less people and social distancing of at least six (6) feet of separation between people within their business. In accordance with the State of Missouri Stay Home Order, beauty shops, barber shops, nail salons, and spas will remain closed.

Can I dine-in at a restaurant now?

No. Odessa restaurants, bars, social clubs, and other facilities that prepare or serve food are deemed essential, but only to the extent necessary to provide drive-thru, curbside pick-up, or deliveries. All dining rooms will remain closed through the duration of this extended Order.

When will the Stay Home Order be lifted?

The extended Order is in place until 11:59 pm on Sunday, May 3, 2020. It will be reevaluated before it expires to determine if revisions and/or extensions are needed.
